W26 To discuss the use of the CIL Monies

The Parish Council has been informed that it has a total of £41,906.43 currently available less £6940.36 for the upgrade to LED of the 13 no. streetlights on Selby Road and the Vehicle Activated Sign installed on Weeland Road.

Councillors discussed the possible locations for the siting of a Youth Shelter, and the removal of the adventure trail at the Westfield play area and its replacement. It was suggested that it may be possible to get a Youth Shelter added to the planning application for the Bowmans site. The Clerk will contact Selby District Council Planning Dept to see what is involved.

The Clerk will look for the email sent some time ago by Councillor Stone regarding Youth Shelters and costs and will also contact play equipment companies for prices of play equipment to replace the adventure trail. All information received will be forwarded to Councillors to look at.

The Clerk will contact Kellington Parish Council to see who installed all their play equipment

The installation of the millstones using CIL monies was also discussed as this project has stalled. The Clerk will contact the Officer at NYCC to see how to move this forward

It was suggested that hanging baskets be installed on lampposts, similar to those in Kellington. Also, to look at improving Hut Green roundabout. The Clerk will contact Kellington Parish Council for a contact

W27 To discuss the request by a Resident's son for a Memorial Bench to be installed at the Village Hall

The son of a resident who has recently passed away, and her husband, a past Parish Councillor, has asked if a memorial bench could be installed at the front of the village hall on one of the grassy areas.

Councillors are happy with the idea but need to discuss the proposal with the Village Hall Committee before responding to the residents' son and arranging a meeting.

W28 To discuss current highway matters

Darren Griffiths has visited Eggborough and has identified potential locations for the Vehicle Activated Sign

- Column 15 for southbound traffic on Kellington Lane
- Column 8 for both directions on Selby Road (outside Surgery)
- Column 2 for both directions on Weeland Road

He would recommend a speed survey first to confirm the sign is necessary on these roads.

Councillors are happy with the sites but do not feel that a speed survey is required as Speedwatch figures are available, so it is already known what areas need monitoring

Councillor Cotter has previously said he can make up the brackets and the clips can be obtained so there is minimal cost involved in resiting to the new locations.
